<u>Mr Stephen WONG Kai-yi</u> *Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data, Hong Kong, Office of the Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data, Hong Kong (PCPD)*

Mr Stephen WONG joined the Attorney General's Chambers of the Hong Kong Government as a Crown Counsel in 1986. In 1991, he was seconded to the United Nations Human Rights Committee based in Geneva. In 1992, he became the Assistant Director of Public Prosecutions. From 1996 to 2014, Mr Wong assumed the offices of Deputy Solicitor-General and Secretary of the Hong Kong Law Reform Commission, responsible for human rights, cross-boundary legal affairs, Basic Law, law reform and legal policies. His fields of expertise also include commercial law, arbitration law, intellectual property and criminal law. Before being appointed as the Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data of Hong Kong in August 2015, he had been in private practice as a barrister-at-law, specializing in public law.

Dr Henry CHANG is a Chief Personal Data Officer at the Office of the Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data in Hong Kong and he is responsible for privacy policy, research, and international liaison. Dr Chang is a fellow of the British Computer Society and a Chartered Engineer and holds industry certifications on privacy, IT security and IT security audit. He is also a Hong Kong appointed technical expert to the Identity Management and Privacy Technologies Working Group (SC27 WG5) in the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

Mr Warren KWOK is a member of the Internet Security and Privacy Working Group, Internet Society Hong Kong.
